

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Driving to the Tillamook Coast

The Tillamook Coast is just 73 miles from Portland. You can reach the region several ways: Highway 26 to Highway 101, and turn south; Highway 26 to Highway 6, taking you through the Tillamook State Forest and into the center of downtown Tillamook; or Highway 22 to Highway 16, which then intersects with the southernmost part of the Tillamook Coast.



Bus Service

The Wave provides dial-a-ride services to every village in the Tillamook Coast, as well as passenger bus transportation as far north to Cannon Beach, south to Lincoln City, and east to Portland. The Wave is also part of the NW Connector, a coordinated regional transit system that offers intercity bus service with connections to various cities in Northwest Oregon. Buses have a two-bike capacity and are ADA accessible with a wheelchair lift.





FRESH FROM THE SEA

Commercial fishing is a heritage industry that continues to play an active and vital role in the identity and local economy of the Tillamook Coast.

Shop the Docks Tours

Garibaldi

Get a behind-the-scenes tour of the commercial docks and where to buy seafood directly – be it “off the boat” or at one of the independent local seafood markets. You’ll gain a better understanding about why purchasing locally caught seafood is an important step in supporting the local economy and learn best buying tips about what to look for and what questions to ask, thus ensuring that a trip to the Port of Garibaldi for seafood is worth the effort – no matter what time of year.

Garibaldi Cannery

Garibaldi

Looking for a place to sample several local seafood products at once? Try the Garibaldi Cannery. This seafood market in Oregon’s Authentic Fishing Village purchases its products directly from local fishermen. It offers everything from smoked tuna and full fish, to steamer clams and oysters.

The Spot

The Spot is a small shop with a big personality. The “charter office-turned-seafood store” carries on a family tradition of fishing for owner Kelly Barnett, who stocks the store with his daily catches of salmon, lingcod, rockfish, halibut and more from his commercial vessels, the Good Intentions and the Silver Girl.

Pacific Oyster Company

Bay City

Pacific Oyster Company boasts a big seafood market with a great selection of local products – and some of the freshest seafood and shellfish on the Oregon coast. The market offers outdoor dining and online ordering, as well as a variety of gourmet foods, beer, wine, clothing, canned goods and more!



JAndy Oyster Co.

JAndy's Tillamook storefront is as small and cozy as the three-member family that owns the oyster growing operation, which grows millions of oysters in Netarts Bay at any given time. Each oyster is raised with care in a pristine estuary, making them some of the tastiest in the world. Retail pick up or dine in at the oyster bar.

Nevør Shellfish Farm

Near Netarts

At Nevør Shellfish Farm, they do things a little differently. Their oysters grow in bags and on lines that the tide tumbles, instead of on the bottom of the bay, so the water the shellfish filter gives them a unique, briny taste. Want another distinctive taste? Try the smoked oysters, which come in a variety of delicious flavors.

Amy Seymour's great-grandmother used to make and sell butter from a couple of milk cows. These days, Amy is milking 300 cows on the same, and additional, land her forefathers worked. She's also using 1,000 pounds of that milk a day to make and sell camembert, brie, gouda and havarti cheeses at the Nestucca Bay Creamery Cheese Shop in Cloverdale. The shop is just a few miles from where her pioneering family's roots were first established close to 150 years ago.

Werner Brewing Company

Tillamook's newest brewery, Werner Brewing Company was started by the same family known for Werner Jerky. Two brothers began brewing beer in the family's jerky facility and later expanded to form Werner Beef and Brew, a deli and taproom that features the brothers' beers, as well as beers from other small breweries that can't be found in larger stores.

de Garde Brewing

is famous for their unique beers. Instead of using regular brewer's yeast, de Garde Brewing uses a spontaneous fermentation technique that relies on natural yeast in the environment. The unconventional brewing method creates uncommon beers that draw visitors from far and wide.

Big Wave Cafe

Manzanita

Food is about family and feelings – and so is the Big Wave Café. This restaurant is not a place to get away, but rather a place to come together. Each meal is fresh, simple and prepared with respect. And many of the dishes combine ingredients from local producers, including Jacobsen Salt Company, Blue Heron Cheese Company, Tillamook Creamery and Bennett Family Farms.

MacGregor's: A Whiskey Bar

Manzanita

Reading and drinking scotch have always made a fine pair, so it only made sense for literary agent Chip MacGregor and writer Holly MacGregor to follow a lifelong passion in opening an upscale, intimate whiskey lounge! MacGregor's offers more than 200 bottles of whiskey and scotch, along with great food. Enjoy a dram from the largest selection on the coast!

Offshore Grill & Coffee House

Manzanita

Don't let the casual atmosphere fool you: Offshore Grill and Coffee House serves five-star quality meals. Head chef Jake Burden prides himself on dreaming up "black tie" dishes that are made from Pacific Northwest agricultural products, with an emphasis on the Tillamook Coast.

Wanda's Café & Bakery

Nehalem

Just like grandma's kitchen, scents of fresh baked bread, scones and muffins waft out of Wanda's Cafe to make your mouth water. All of the sweets and treats are baked in-house, along with rotating menus for lunch and dinner that feature gourmet burgers, seafood fettuccine and pan-seared salmon. Finish it all off with the bakery's legendary big cinnamon roll!

Sand Dollar Restaurant & Lounge

Rockaway

Inspired by her own family recipes, owner and chef Emma Poulsen brings a European flavor to lunch and dinner at the Sand Dollar. She refuses to compromise on quality, so her staff sources fresh ingredients from local farmers markets, vendors and seafood suppliers. Even the view is high-quality: The oceanfront property offers diners a direct view of the Pacific.



Portside Bistro

Gourmet comfort food. That's what's on the menu at Portside Bistro. Nestled back on the north end of Garibaldi Marina, this family-owned café specializes in smoked meats (locally sourced, of course) and small batch meals made from scratch.

Fish Peddler at Pacific Oyster

Pacific Seafood manages every part of the seafood supply chain, from harvesting and fishing, to processing and distributing. The family-owned company even serves up meals at their Fish Peddler restaurant! Belly up to the oyster bar for an oyster shooter or bowl of fresh clam chowder while you watch the fresh fish and shellfish get express shipped all over the country!

Grateful Bread & Bakery

Pacific City

The name started as a play on words, but it wasn't long until fans of the legendary band The Grateful Dead began flocking to this bakery. Dead Head or not, you're in for a treat at Grateful Bread. The baked goods are fresh, and the lunch and dinner menu are locally sourced. Dory-caught fish are a specialty, including lingcod sandwiches and fresh fish tacos.

Meridian Restaurant & Bar at Headlands

Pacific City

Savor the innovative northwest coastal cuisine of Meridian while drinking in spectacular views of Haystack Rock and the rolling Pacific Ocean. Meridian's chef team uses fresh seafood and ingredients from area farmers on its one-of-a-kind locally sourced menu.

The Riverhouse Nestucca

Pacific City

Popular Portland chef Jeremy Davidson sold his Portland Soup Company food cart to re-open the equally popular Riverhouse Nestucca on the Nestucca River. The menu offers seasonal and locally sourced meals, custom cocktails, beer and wine, including wines from Twist Wine Company just down the road.

Hawk Creek Café

Neskowin

Tucked between Hawk Creek and the rugged coastline, Hawk Creek Café has long served as a central meeting place for the Neskowin Village. Visitors and locals alike love their high-quality, no-fuss food. Their wood-fired pizza – with slow-rise dough and fresh toppings – draws people from across the region.



BEACH SAFETY

While there is a lot of fun to be had along the Tillamook Coast, please be aware of the dangers associated with ocean activities. Oregon's beaches are not manned by lifeguards, so it is up to you to take the necessary precautions to have a safe, fun trip to the beach. Sneaker waves and riptides make up the majority of rescue attempts, so it is important to be informed about the signs and characteristics of these hazards.

COASTLINE BEACHES





Here in Oregon, we don't call the beach the beach. We call it the coast. But of all the wonderful things about our coast, the best is that all 363 miles are free and open to everyone.

Explore landmarks big and small. While the sandy city beaches are popular with visitors, there is more diversity here than meets the eye. Along with the sunny days that bring surfing, tanning and outdoor activities like fishing, the beach also provides great opportunities for bird-watching on marshy estuaries, tidepooling on rocky shores or visiting lighthouses on coastal headlands.

STAY SAFE

Any time you're planning a trip to the shore—but perhaps especially when you're going to remote or "hidden" spots—pay attention to the weather forecast, sunset time and the tide schedule to stay safe. And as much as you may want to keep secret spots, you know, secret, always tell someone where you're going!



Manzanita Beach

Manzanita

Snuggled within a landscape of spruce and pines on the north coast is a pretty little oceanside city boasting a stretch of seven miles of pristine white sand beachfront. Did you know that Manzanita holds the title of having the third-most photographed scenery in all of Oregon? Maybe that's because you can get a picture of the scenery without too many beach bodies scattered throughout the shot. The Manzanita weather is perfect, so you can spend a day at the beach with the sun, while other areas of the Oregon coast are covered in clouds.

Rockaway Beach

Rockaway Beach

With seven miles of sandy beach and more than 100 vacation rental houses and 200 hotel rooms to choose from, there is no lack of things to do and places to stay in family-friendly Rockaway Beach. The beachfront here is what coastal dreams are made of. Enjoy beachcombing, metal detecting, kite flying (there is an annual kite festival in August), shopping at Warehouse 10 or walking in the peaceful sunset. Explore numerous intertidal pools where you may see colored starfish varying from lavender to gold.





Cape Meares Beach

Cape Meares

Cape Meares is a sleepy village by the ocean, tucked between a lake and the large bluff of the same name. Surrounded by forest and water, the town is steeped in tales from the past, and the beach is often blanketed in a mystical Pacific fog. That makes it the perfect place for a peaceful walk on the sand, followed by an evening around the campfire sharing historic or mysterious stories of your own! Want more space on the sand? Set out across the beach for Bayocean Spit, the location of an old ghost town with miles more coastline and stories to learn.

Oceanside Beach

Oceanside

Oceanside is built upon a steep hillside that overlooks the beachfront and offers stunning views of the Pacific Ocean. As you walk along the beach, you will discover a tunnel through one of the vertical sea cliffs leading to yet another beautiful beach to explore. Just up the road is the iconic Cape Meares Lighthouse.



BEACH WHEELCHAIRS

The beach should be accessible to everyone – and on the Tillamook Coast, it is! Borrow a fat-tire wheelchair at no cost through the Manzanita Visitor Center, Troxel’s in Rockaway Beach or Kiwanda Hospitality in Pacific City. The chairs easily roll through sand, making a beach day fun for all!



Tierra Del Mar

25 miles south of Tillamook

Coming from the north, head down the Three Capes Scenic Route through a winding stretch of thick forest canopies and a variety of homesteads and ranches, with glimpses of the bay through the trees. As the road begins to straighten out and the trees disappear, you are presented with a captivating view of the Pacific Ocean and Tierra Del Mar. This two-mile stretch of pristine beach features dramatic views of Cape Kiwanda to the south and Cape Lookout to the north.

Bob Straub State Park

Pacific City

Take a scenic saunter on the peaceful and wildlife laden Bob Straub State Park. Named after the former state treasurer who helped preserve the pristine Nestucca Spit by advocating that Highway 101 veer inland, this sandy oasis is Pacific City's pride and joy. Find trails for hiking and horses, picnic tables and ADA restrooms. The 484-acre beach park is open year-round and is free for public day use.





Neskowin Beach

Neskowin

This wide, three-mile beach is rarely crowded allowing visitors to rejuvenate. Launch your canoe or kayak through the pristine bird estuary of Nestucca Bay.


This beach also features the Neskowin Ghost Forest. Though hidden most of the time, this “forest” appears at low tide for a truly unique view. Partially buried in the sand, 2,000-year-old tree trunks pepper the shoreline here. The vestiges of an ancient Sitka spruce forest, a hundred or so “ghost” trees are visible only when the tide rolls out. (At high tide, the beach at the edge of Neskowin is scenic, the view dotted with sea stacks and tide pools.) Wander through the ghost trees, photograph them or wait until the waterline recedes further to reveal the nearby island of Proposal Rock. Hike up the trail and access an amazing view of the ocean and the Ghost Forest below!

WEAVING THE PAST & PRESENT

Have you learned about the treasure allegedly buried on Neahkahnie Mountain? Or have you heard the story of the first pilgrim who built his house inside a tree stump? What about the town built along Bayocean Spit that fell into the ocean? You'll learn about these stories and many more during a trip to the Tillamook County Pioneer Museum.

After you stop by the Museum, go out and see the living history yourself. Textile arts are not only preserved, but created on a daily basis at the Latimer Quilt & Textile Center. Gaze out at the same bay Captain Robert Gray sailed from the door of the Garibaldi Museum. Imagine soaring about the coast onboard a World War II blimp at the Tillamook Air Museum. STEWARDS OF LAND AND SEA

Pier's End Boathouse

Garibaldi

It is worth a visit not only because it offers a unique vantage point for viewing Tillamook Bay, but because the decommissioned U.S. Coast Guard lifeboat station represents the region's maritime history. It is one of the few of its kind built over the water and using a marine railway to launch motor lifeboats. Pier's End Boathouse was constructed in the mid-1930s to house two 36-foot motor lifeboats and a 26-foot, oar-powered surfboat. All three vessels were launched on rails, fully manned and ready to search for seafarers in distress, through large doors. Coast Guard personnel winched the boats back into the building when they returned.

Cape Meares Lighthouse

Near Oceanside

Cape Meares Lighthouse may be the shortest on the Oregon coast, but it features an impressive, kerosene-powered lens. First lit on Jan. 1, 1890, the first order Fresnel lens was one of the most powerful and largest of its day. Mariners could spot the distinctive red-and-white flashes from more than 21 miles away. A paved 0.2-mile path leads from the main parking area to the lighthouse, passing many viewpoints and interpretive panels along the way. The inside of the lighthouse and a gift shop are open May to September. The tower is open by tour only. Admission is free, and no reservations are needed. For everyone's safety, no backpacks and no carrying children.

Tillamook Forest Center

22 miles east of Tillamook

The Tillamook Forest Center is a shining jewel on the Tillamook Coast. An engaging interpretive center tells the story of the historic Tillamook Burn and reforestation. Don't miss the powerful film, *Legacy of Fire*, shown in the center's surroundsound theater. tillamookforestcenter.org

Alder Creek Farm houses a community garden, greenhouse, ethnobotanical trail, native plant nursery and a 50-acre wildlife sanctuary on the north edge of Nehalem Bay. It's a center for community activities, learning and teaching about organic farming. Alder Creek Farm also houses the Nehalem Teaching Trail, a hands-on learning experience that invites audiences to investigate native plants, their habitats and the ancient Indian traditions surrounding their uses.

CAPES & SPITS

Cape Meares

Near Oceanside

Take the short jaunt to the lighthouse or Octopus Tree (at the end of the Cape Meares Loop), or lace up your boots and hike the 885-foot trail down to the beach, passing by the 144-foot tall Big Spruce that's 4-feet in diameter.

Cape Lookout

Eight miles south of Netarts

The 5-plus mile round-trip trail offers one of the best whale-watching perches on the Oregon Coast. The trail starts out flat, then drops slightly toward the tip of the cape, with steep cliffs.

Bayocean Spit

Near Cape Meares

With the bay on one side and a wide expansive beach on the other – connected by sandy trails lined with salal and sword fern – Bayocean Spit, located near the village of Cape Meares, is a hiking and birding hotspot, and home to beaver and deer.

Cape Kiwanda

Near Pacific City

The hike up the sandy, 230-foot dune of Cape Kiwanda in Pacific City is relatively easy, and it rewards with views of dory launches and landings, and crashing waves aloft with surfers. Coming down is easy too – just slide on your butt.

Nestucca Spit

Near Pacific City

Start at the Bob Straub State Park Trailhead in Pacific City (off Sunset Drive) and walk across the dunes towards the ocean. At spit's end, harbor seals and fishermen vie for the Nestucca River's legendary salmon and steelhead.

VISTAS & WATERFALLS

Neahkahnie Mountain

Near Manzanita

This thigh-thumping hike starts at Oswald West State Park (look for hiker-symbol between milepost 41-42 on Highway 101), but rewards you with a breathtaking view of the long stretch of beach below near Manzanita.

Munson Creek Falls

Seven miles south of Tillamook

Perhaps Tillamook's shortest hike, at just one-quarter mile, takes you to its tallest waterfall, at 319 feet. Go in the rainy season when the falls are gushing and ferns are dripping with dew.

Kings Mountain

Twenty-five miles east of Tillamook

Five miles of rugged trail with a 2,500-foot gain in elevation (and some of it steep), this hike starts at a trail head off the Wilson River Highway (Highway 6, milepost 25). From the summit, take in the awe of the Lester Creek Valley.

Mt. Hebo

Five miles east of Hebo


The tallest peak in the Coast Range, a hike up this mountain starts at Hebo Lake Campground. Look for Indian Trail. You'll pass through two forest meadows before reaching the peak and a glimpse of the ocean.



NATURE & WILDLIFE

One of the best kept secrets of the Tillamook Coast is the number of nature and wildlife reserves to explore. From Manzanita to Neskowin, and all places in between, there are many protected areas to hike, stroll, watch birds, spot wildlife and learn about natural history.





FIND YOUR BEST NATURE SPOT

Kilchis Point Reserve

Near Bay City

This interpretive trail weaves wildlife, pioneer history and Native American history into one beautiful reserve. The trails – all ADA friendly – lead to a birdwatching station and a view of Tillamook Bay untouched by civilization.

Cape Meares National Wildlife Refuge

Near Oceanside

Just north of Oceanside (at the end of the Cape Meares Loop), lush with moss-draped trees, this refuge is a green haven for those wanting to recharge their spirits and view wildlife, too. The refuge is near Cape Meares Lighthouse, which offers its own brand of viewing and history.

Three Arch Rocks National Wildlife Refuge

Oceanside

This untamed marine environment in Oceanside features big colonies of seabirds that hang out on offshore rocks. Peregrine falcons, common murre and other seabirds nest as whales and sea lions frolic in the waters below.

Whalen Island

Near Pacific City

Clay Myers State Natural Area on Whalen Island just north of Pacific City offers a pristine 1.4-mile loop hike that overlooks a rich tidal wetland before passing through mixed woodlands, offering views of the estuary joining the ocean.



Sand Lake Estuary

Near Pacific City

Oregon has 22 major estuaries, but only five are so untouched that they are classified as “natural.” North of Pacific City, the 897-acre Sand Lake Estuary is the largest of these.

Sitka Sedge State Natural Area

Near Pacific City

Oregon’s newest park, Sitka Sedge State National Area showcases one of the state’s last intact estuaries. The area’s natural beauty shines bright, thanks to the intentional lack of development that protects the pastures, sand dunes and bird habitat. The main trail leads you through the undisturbed landscape and by blooming foxglove, salal and wild rose flowers gorgeous enough to leave you spellbound.

Nestucca Bay National Wildlife Refuge

Near Neskowin

Welcome to Nestucca Bay National Wildlife Refuge. It offers more than 1,200 acres of refuge south of Pacific City and winter habitat for varieties of geese, including the rare Semidi Islands goose. Black-tailed deer and harbor seals also call this place home.

WHALE WATCHING

Contrary to popular belief, whale watching can be a year-round activity, with gray whales the most commonly seen. Almost any location with an ocean view may offer whale sightings. You will have a better chance of spotting a whale in the morning. First scan the ocean for spouting and then zoom in more closely with binoculars.

To get an even closer view, consider whale watching with Garibaldi Charters. Their boats will find and follow the gentle giants. garibaldicharters.com

SEASONAL VIEWING

Elk Everywhere!

Keep Your Eyes Open

Maybe it's the unpredictability of when they might appear, or maybe it's their inherent majesty in the naturally beautiful landscape. Whatever the reason, nothing quite compares to spotting one of our resident elk herds. Remember: Look but don't touch. We love our elk, but approaching these animals is very dangerous.

King Tides

Entire Coastline

Extremely high "King Tides" occur a few times throughout the year, when a new or full moon is closest to the Earth. This natural phenomenon provides a mesmerizing show of the power of the ocean. But be warned: King Tides create extremely hazardous beach conditions, even for experienced beach-goers. Some tidal surges breach well beyond the beach, and unexpected "sneaker" waves can knock a person off their feet and sweep them into the ocean. So please watch from a safe distance and never turn your back on the water!





MARINE RESERVES

The Tillamook Coast is lucky enough to have two marine reserves. Marine reserves are dedicated to conservation and scientific research, so please leave all sea life behind for others to enjoy.

Cape Falcon

Near Manzanita

Cape Falcon has sand that provides the ideal home for crabs and other animals that like soft bottom habitats. Along the shore, you'll find rocky intertidal habitats to the north and south of Short Sand Beach, where you can spot mussels and sea anemones attached to the rocks.

Cascade Head Marine Reserve

Near Neskowin

Travel south to Neskowin, and you'll enjoy the beginning of Cascade Head Marine Reserve. Underwater here, the reserve includes the north segment of the Siletz Reef. This is an extensive rocky reef home to many species of groundfish, such as canary rockfish; invertebrates, such as giant plumose anemones; and seaweeds.

Salmon, steelhead, tuna and lingcod are the top four species in our waters—but there's lots more to catch. Go out on your own or with a guide. A charter boat can show you a thing or two and get you out on the water for deep sea fishing to catch halibut, tuna, lingcod, rock fish and sea trout.

HELP KEEP OUR WATERS PRISTINE

Visitors are drawn to the Tillamook Coast for the miles and miles of waterline. And local residents and visitors work very hard to keep them pristine. Tillamook Estuaries Partnership (TEP) is a part of 28 National Estuary Projects that works to protect and restore the health of estuaries. TEP's work currently encompasses all bays and watersheds in Tillamook County. The organization works to address loss of fish and wildlife, water quality, erosion, education and citizen involvement and stewardship.

DORY BOAT FISHING

Almost as iconic as Haystack Rock, dory boats have become a symbol of Cape Kiwanda. Traditional dories have been used for hundreds of years, not just in the Northwest but across North America. They were designed to carry thousands of pounds of wet fish and have been known, historically, for their sturdy design—allowing them to carry a heavy load for their relatively modest size, without capsizing.

However, they serve as more than just an icon for this beautiful area; they also provide a unique fishing opportunity. There are a variety of dory boat chartered trips available in Pacific City including bottom fish, salmon, halibut and Dungeness crab. Adventurers also will get to experience the thrill of a dory boat beach launch and landing!

CLAMMING & CRABBING

There are five rivers that flow into Tillamook Bay, producing some of the best bay fishing, clam digging and crabbing west of the Mississippi. Nehalem Bay, Tillamook Bay and Netarts Bay all have local marinas where boats and equipment can be rented and bait purchased.

Jetty Fishery offers a guided experience. You can harvest crabs directly from the docks at the marinas. You can also secure the necessary supplies for Nestucca Bay in nearby Pacific City. Several other marinas in Tillamook County include Garibaldi Marina, Kelly's Brighton Marina, Netarts Bay Marina and Wheeler Marina, which are also great Oregon Coast crabbing spots. Didn't get your Dungeness crab today? That's okay! Head back to Kelly's Brighton Marina and watch as the staff pulls a Dungeness crab from the live well, cooks and cleans it. Then you get to eat it!





Whether winding through the forest or following alongside the coastline, the scenic routes on the Tillamook Coast thrill visitors and locals alike with their magnificent views no matter the time of year. You won't regret taking the long way home as you revel in each breathtaking sight along these roadways.



Pacific Coast Scenic Byway

Highway 101 along Oregon Coast

One of the oldest scenic routes in the United States, the Pacific Coast Scenic Byway spans the full 363 miles of Oregon's coastline. The byway begins at the northwest tip of Oregon in Astoria, winding past cliffs and coves as it enters the northern portion of the Tillamook Coast. Here, the byway follows alongside the ocean, bays and rivers until veering inland to explore marshes, agricultural valleys and temperate rainforests. The byway runs right by the Tillamook Creamery and through downtown Tillamook, offering a chance to stop for eats or recreation. As it continues south, it guides drivers west to meet back with the coastline near Neskowin. As it leaves the Tillamook Coast, the roadway heads toward other coastal cities, including Newport, Coos Bay and Brookings.

Trees to Sea Scenic Byway


Banks to Cape Meares

The 68 mile Trees to Sea Scenic Byway begins at the trailhead for the Banks-Vernonia State Trail in Banks, Oregon, and proceeds down Main Street (Highway 47) to turn west on State Highway 6 near mile marker 49 to head toward the City of Tillamook.

The route then arcs north and west on Tillamook County's Wilson River Loop and Latimer Roads, in order to turn south on Highway 101 before turning right on State Highway 131 (Third Street in the City of Tillamook) for almost its full length until it ends at Cape Meares Lighthouse.

The Trees to Sea Scenic Byway route combines an abundance of local agriculture and forestry, history and natural scenery in a manner where the sum is stronger than the individual parts. The traveler will witness a broad spectrum of intrinsic qualities ranging from the vast variety of scenic, historic, natural and forestry values to be found when exploring the agricultural delights of rural western Washington County, passing through the Tillamook State Forest, moving along the Cape Meares peninsula, and viewing the expanse of the Tillamook Bay watershed. When travelers stop, they will be amazed by the extensive menu of ready recreational tangents onto which they can launch.

Cape Meares, Cape Lookout & Cape Kiwanda

If you're looking for the most breathtaking views of the Tillamook Coast, the Three Capes Scenic Route is the perfect place to start. Beginning in downtown Tillamook, this short 40-mile jaunt along the water reveals some of the most majestic natural landscapes that the Oregon Coast has to offer. The road is easy to follow, with ample signage that leads travelers west of Tillamook to Oceanside, up to Cape Meares Light House, back through Netarts then down to Cape Lookout and Cape Kiwanda.

As the scenic route leads you from Tillamook toward Oceanside, you'll be thrilled at the mesmerizing ocean views that have left people speechless for centuries. A marked route from Oceanside will take you on up to Cape Meares Light House, the shortest lighthouse on the Oregon coast. (Stop for a quick hike from the lighthouse to the giant Octopus Tree or to Big Sitka Spruce – a tree too big to hug!)

Watch the ocean meet tranquil Netarts Bay as you travel up to Cape Lookout, where you are in a prime position to see the entire Tillamook coastline. Trek through the old-growth forest and along the beach here to stretch your legs. From there, the road takes you through the Sandlake dunes into Pacific City, where Haystack Rock juts up from the depths of the Pacific Ocean at Cape Kiwanda. Drink in the magnificent view of this iconic coastal landmark.
