

Comfort Food with “Refined Twist”

Garibaldi Portside Bistro

It's a calm Thursday night near the Port of Garibaldi. Still seas. Red sky. Boats bobbing softly in the water. But the kitchen is buzzing at the Garibaldi Portside Bistro. Customers pack the dining room, salivating at the smells wafting from the kitchen.

It's no surprise that people have driven miles to eat here. Behind the scenes, Cordon Bleu-trained chef Dennis Cavitt is at work. Smoked meats, his specialty, fly out the kitchen door—while only empty dishes return.

“I'm passionate about what we do,” Cavitt says. “We're friendly. We produce good, quality products. We're doing something different.”

He explains that he grew up vacationing in the area. “There are pictures of me in my mom's stomach in Garibaldi,” he says. Then he brought Amanda. The first summer they came, they were dating. Then married. And then, with a baby. It felt like home.

In 2016, the couple opened the Garibaldi Portside Bistro with a menu full of refined comfort foods. The most popular? By far the Blueberry Goat Cheese Burger: a half-pound patty, topped with goat cheese, bacon, blueberry sauce, tomato, onion, avocado, mixed greens and aioli.

“It's something I came up with two years ago for Mother's Day,” Dennis says. And it's remained a fixture on the menu. His ingenuity is always leading to new creations that customers love. Like the time he spent the morning cooking crab for crab melts: they sold out in 30 minutes.

Amanda grins as she says the “permanent cologne” of her family is now smoked wood, but they're doing what they love. “We had some really great supporters from the get-go,” she says. “We wouldn't be this far along if it wasn't for some of our customers who have become friends.”

Their success spurred them forward and Dennis and Amanda recently acquired the former Troller Restaurant and spend a significant amount of time remodeling their newly, expanded location.

Looking around their new space, with a 180-degree view of Tillamook Bay, Dennis and Amanda are filled with gratitude. “We're so grateful about where we've gotten to,” Dennis says. “It's about relationships. We truly love what we do. I want to make people happy.”

Chef profile: Jake Burden Offshore Grill



While on vacation in Rockaway Beach, bring the family on down to town to enjoy the exquisite delectables that the Offshore Grill and Coffee House has to offer.

The location has a dual personality as a coffee shop and restaurant. A few years back, Chef Jake Burden's family had hit a period of dramatic events. When the previous owners of the Offshore Grill came to them and offered their location, Jake took it as a sign.

“It was a sign that was offered to us,” Burden said. “It all clicked, it all seemed to just fit. The timing worked so well for us in where we were with everything. Michelle and I found ourselves literally being offered the dream we’d always talked about doing: opening our own restaurant.”

The Offshore offers some of the finest ingredients including fresh produce from Brickyard Farms, grass fed meats from Nehalem River Ranch, and the freshest seafood around from Garibaldi's Community Supported Fishery.

“It's truly our passion,” Jake said.

Seed to Sip at North Fork 53

The North Coast's only tea-growing farm

On the banks of the Nehalem River sits a 1930s farmhouse. It's tucked away on Highway 53, surrounded by lush vegetation of the valley.

Inside, Ginger and Brigham Edwards brew tea. It's a far cry from preparing a supermarket teabag. The water is warmed to 180 degrees.

A mixture of teas is selected for optimal nourishment. It steeps for only a few minutes.

And then, it's time to sit. Sit and watch the river run by. Sit and melt into the lush valley. Sit and watch the very tea in your cup, grow in the garden.

"The beauty of tea is this...you get to sit down," Ginger said. "It's this moment in our day to sit and reconnect with each other. We associate it with happiness and that's what we wanted to create on our farm. Isn't that a good place to start?"

Ginger and Brigham's North Fork 53 Coastal Retreat and Tea Gardens, located just 10 minutes outside of Nehalem, is the first farm to grow tea commercially on the West Coast. And of only 12 in the entire country.

In 2007, Ginger began sustainably farming a small plot of land in Nehalem with hand-sown carrots and potatoes. In 2015, her and Brigham purchased the North Fork 53 farmhouse that was originally an 1895 homestead. Milk from the farm would be loaded onto boats on the river and sent downstream to the Mohler Creamery.

Currently 250 tea plants grow on the three-acre property, but their goal is to have 1,000. The home features four rooms that can be rented out individually or for group trips.

While staying at the Retreat Center, visitors can tour the tea gardens and are welcome to sample the bounty from the tea bar.

"Tea is a cultural experience," Ginger said. "Tea can be a year-round experience. In the garden, during the summer: iced. Steamed in the winter. Tea gives you that medicinal nourishment into your body right away and feels that affect."

If you can't get to North Fork 53, they'll send their tea to you. With a Communittea Subscription, you will receive the tea of the month straight from Nehalem, to wherever your front door is. Seed to sip every time.

"Our goal is to get as many people to taste it as possible," Ginger said.





Rockaway Beach

While there is a lot of fun to be had along the Tillamook Coast, please be aware of the dangers associated with ocean activities. Oregon's beaches are not manned by lifeguards, so it is up to you to take the necessary precautions to have a safe, fun trip to the beach. Sneaker waves and riptides make up the majority of rescue attempts, so it is important to be informed about the signs and characteristics of these hazards.




Neahkahnie Mountain

This thigh-thumping hike starts at Oswald West State Park (look for hiker-symbol between milepost 41-42 on Highway 101), but rewards you with a breath-taking view of the long stretch of beach below near Manzanita.




Munson Creek Falls

Tillamook's perhaps shortest hike (at just one-quarter mile) takes you to its tallest waterfall, at 319 feet. Go in the rainy season when the falls are gushing and ferns are dripping with dew. Located seven miles south of Tillamook.



Kings Mountain

Five miles of rugged trail with a 2,500-foot gain in elevation (and some of it steep), this hike starts at a trail head off the Wilson River Highway (Highway 6, milepost 25). From the summit, take in the awe of the Lester Creek Valley.




Nestucca Spit

Start at the Bob Straub State Park Trailhead in Pacific City (off Sunset Drive) and walk across the dunes towards the ocean. At spit's end, harbor seals and fishermen vie for the Nestucca River's legendary salmon and steelhead.



Cape Meares

Take the short jaunt to the lighthouse or Octopus Tree (at the end of the Cape Meares Loop), or lace up your boots and hike the 885-foot trail down to the beach, passing by the 144-foot tall Big Spruce that's 4-feet in diameter.




Cape Lookout

The 5-plus mile round-trip trail offers one of the best whale-watching perches on the Oregon Coast. Trail starts out flat, then drops slightly toward the tip of the cape, with steep cliffs. The Trailhead is 8 miles south of Netarts.



Cape Kiwanda

The hike up the sandy, 230-foot dune of Cape Kiwanda in Pacific City is relatively easy, and it rewards with views of dory launches and landings, and crashing waves aloft with surfers. Coming down is easy – just slide on your butt.



Mt. Hebo

The tallest peak in the Coast Range, a hike up this mountain starts at Hebo Lake Campground. Look for Indian Trail. You'll pass through two forest meadows before reaching the peak and a glimpse of the ocean.

▲ Off Road

The Tillamook Forest, if it isn't already, should be your destination of choice for mountain biking. The Wilson River Trail isn't exactly flying under the radar. There's a popular trail that extends 20-plus miles through the coast range between Tillamook and Portland. Or take your mountain bikes up to the summit of Highway 6 where you'll find several other biking trailheads that are interconnected.

Living history

Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad

It was the late 1800s. Portland was rapidly growing.

Out on the coast, most of the land had been claimed. But suddenly, people in the small coastal villages noticed there was no way to get their products to the bigger cities.

“The market was very undependable getting dairy to market,” Historian Mark Beach said. “By the time the railroad comes to Tillamook; Garibaldi, Bay City, and Nehalem are the only real established towns at that time in 1906-07.”

The first train reached Tillamook in November, 1911 via the Salmonberry River west from Portland, south from Mohler through Wheeler, Rockaway Beach and Garibaldi, to Tillamook. The construction of the railroad along the Tillamook Coast encouraged real estate and timber sales alike.

With a much easier trip to the area, people flocked to the beach for tourism. Beach’s research details that for many years, trains would stop for locals hitching rides to fish up the Salmonberry. Commuter service from Wheeler to Tillamook proved immediately popular as travel by auto or horse required the long journey via Miami/Foley Road.

The rails also made it easier for products to be transported back and forth between the villages and the metropolitan markets.

“Suddenly, you can cut the logs and bring them down and convert them into lumber and sent back to Portland,” said Beach.

Through the 1920’s, people in the area were making money, hand over fist. After the Great Depression, the railroad saw an increase in business in the 50s when lumber was profitable.

In 1996, the Port of Tillamook Bay took over the operations of the railroad. As a symbol of the times, Beach notes, the engine painted like a Holstein became a familiar site on the rail line.

Then, in 2003, Scott and Kim Wickert founded the Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad. They spent weekend runs from Garibaldi to Rockaway Beach and Wheeler, dodging freight trains while they conducted their historic steam train tours.

After 2007, Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad became the sole operator of 46 miles of the railroad, and continues to be to this day.

Twist Wine Company serves up their own wines – made in McMinnville – in their tasting room in Pacific City.



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

There are five rivers that flow into Tillamook Bay, producing some of the best bay fishing, clam digging and crabbing west of the Mississippi. Nehalem Bay, Tillamook Bay, and Netarts Bay all have local marinas where boats and equipment can be rented and bait purchased.

Jetty Fishery also offers a guided experience. You can harvest crabs directly from the docks at the marinas. You can secure the necessary supplies for Nestucca Bay in nearby Pacific City. Several other marinas in Tillamook County include Garibaldi Marina, Kelly's Brighton Marina, Netarts Bay Marina, and Wheeler Marina, which are also great Oregon Coast crabbing spots.

Didn't get your Dungeness crab today? That's okay: head back to Kelly's Brighton Marina and watch as the staff pulls a Dungeness crab from the live well, cooks, and cleans it. Then you get to eat it!


Dory Boat Fishing

Almost as iconic as Haystack Rock, Dory boats have become a symbol of Cape Kiwanda. Traditional dories have been used for hundreds of years, not just in the Northwest but across North America. They were designed to carry thousands of pounds of wet fish and have been known, historically, for their sturdy design—allowing them to carry a heavy load for their relatively modest size, without capsizing.

However, they serve as more than just an icon for this beautiful area; they also provide a unique fishing opportunity. There are a variety of dory boat-chartered trips available in Pacific City including bottom fish, salmon, halibut, and Dungeness crab. Adventurers will also get to experience the thrill of a dory boat beach launch and landing!

Do your part

Help keep our waters pristine

Visitors are drawn to the Tillamook Coast for the miles and miles of waterline. And local residents and visitors work very hard to keep them pristine.

“When people come recreate they want to see healthy streams and lush forests and they appreciate that,” Tillamook Estuaries Partnership [TEP] Deputy Director Claudine Rehn said.

TEP is a part of 28 National Estuary Projects in the United States that works to protect and restore the health of estuaries. TEP’s work currently encompasses all bays and watersheds in Tillamook County. The organization works to address loss of fish and wildlife, water quality, erosion, education, and citizen involvement and stewardship.

“We found that giving visitors and residents a good sense of place makes them advocates,” Rehn said. “We find that people really want to play an active role. We are the ones that live here, but that doesn’t mean we are the only ones responsible for that.”

Residents and visitors to the area are encouraged to participate in TEP stewardship programs including clean up days.

“Clean up days are when we see the most visitors. They see it happening and spontaneously join,” Rehn said.

In addition to clean up days, the public is invited to TEP’s educational days as a part of the Explore Nature Series: a collaboration between numerous environmental organizations that hosted 74 events this past year. Events included walks through the Kilchis Estuary, mushroom adventures, and Shop at the Dock events in Garibaldi.

“It’s exceeded our expectations,” Rehn said. “People are very interested in knowing about where they live. They want to learn why their resources are important or how they function.”

Visitors are also increasingly more curious about the landscape and environmental health of their vacation spot.

“People are really interested in learning, not just getting a souvenir, but some knowledge,” Rehn said.

▼ Find your best nature spot

One of the best kept secrets of the Tillamook Coast is the number of nature and wildlife reserves to explore. From Manzanita to Neskowin, and all places in between, there are many protected areas to hike, stroll, watch birds, spot wildlife and learn about natural history.

Bayocean Spit

With the bay on one side, and a wide expansive beach on the other – connected by sandy trails lined with salal and sword fern – Bayocean Spit, located near the village of Cape Meares, is a hiking and birding hotspot, and home to beaver and deer.

Cape Meares National Wildlife Refuge

Just north of Oceanside (at the end of the Cape Meares Loop), lush with moss-draped trees, this refuge is a green haven for those wanting to recharge their spirits and view wildlife, too. The refuge is near Cape Meares Lighthouse, which offers its own brand of viewing and history.



Three Arch Rocks National Wildlife Refuge

This untamed marine environment in Oceanside features big colonies of seabirds that hang out on offshore rocks. Peregrine falcons, common mures and other seabirds nest as whales and sea lions frolic in the waters below.



Whalen Island

Clay Myers State Natural Area on Whalen Island just north of Pacific City offers a pristine 1.4-mile loop hike that overlooks a rich tidal wetland before passing through mixed woodlands, offering views of the estuary joining the ocean.



Kilchis Point Reserve

Near Bay City, this interpretive trail weaves wildlife, pioneer history and Native American history in one beautiful reserve. The trails – all ADA friendly – lead to a birdwatching station and a view of Tillamook Bay untouched by civilization.



Nestucca Bay National Wildlife Refuge

Welcome to Nestucca Bay National Wildlife Refuge. It offers more than 1,200 acres of refuge south of Pacific City and winter habitat for varieties of geese, including the rare Semidi Islands goose. Black-tailed deer and harbor seals also call this place home.



Sand Lake Estuary

Oregon has 22 major estuaries, but only five are so untouched that they are classified as “natural.” North of Pacific City, the 897-acre Sand Lake Estuary is the largest of these. A new state park is being developed at the adjoining land, Sitka Sedge State Natural Area.



▼ Sitka Sedge State Natural Area

The main trail leading through the new park on the Three Capes drive is where you will find blooming foxglove, salal and wild rose – the beauty of each will leave you spellbound. So will the abundant bird life and Sitka Sedge grasses that grow along the wetland edges.

▲ Marine Reserves

The Tillamook Coast is lucky enough to have two Marine Reserves. Cape Falcon (near Manzanita) has sand that provides the ideal habitat for crabs and other animals that like soft bottom habitats. Along the shore, you'll find rocky intertidal habitats to the north and south of Short Sand Beach, where you can spot mussels and sea anemones attached to the rocks.

Travel south to Pacific City, and you'll enjoy the beginning of Cascade Head Marine Reserve. Underwater here, the reserve includes the north segment of the Siletz Reef. This is an extensive rocky reef home to many species of groundfish such as canary rockfish, invertebrates such as giant plumose anemones, and seaweeds. Marine Reserves are dedicated to conservation and scientific research, so please leave all sea life behind for others to enjoy.



▼ Whale Watching

Contrary to popular belief, whale watching can be a year-round activity with gray whales the most commonly seen. Almost any location with an ocean view may offer whale sightings. You will have a better chance of spotting a whale in the morning. First scan the ocean for spouting and then zoom in more closely with binoculars. To get an even closer view, consider whale watching from a charter boat; Linda Sue and Garibaldi Charters are good options.



A new cheese in town

Nestucca Bay Creamery

Amy Seymour's great-grandmother used to make and sell butter from a couple of milk cows.

These days, Amy is milking 300 cows on the same, and additional, land her forefathers worked. She's also using 1,000 pounds of that milk a day to make and sell camembert, brie, gouda and havarti cheeses at the Nestucca Bay Creamery Cheese shop in Cloverdale. The shop is just a few miles from where her pioneering family's roots were first established close to 150 years ago.

Amy's grandfather and father were proud members of the Tillamook County Creamery Association. Amy is too. As member/owners in the 109-year-old company, she and her husband Rob Seymour sell the bulk of their cow milk to be made into Tillamook Cheese.

"We're still producers for Tillamook Cheese," Amy enthused. "It's a great company."

Yet something inside Amy yearned to make cheese herself. Maybe that yearning was because one of the couple's three sons, Will Seymour, had a passion for local food. Perhaps it was her ancestral roots beckoning with age-old knowledge.

In her core, Amy understands what those pioneering ancestors discovered: there is a sweetly unique flavoring of milk made by pastured cattle grazing in the salty sea air—that is found in just a few places in the world.

Previous dairying generations in Tillamook County chose to develop cheddar cheese, aged slowly to bring out that taste sensation. Was now the time to try out other old-world cheeses aged in a similar fashion? Amy thought yes.

"We've talked about it for years," she said. "Wherever we travel, we visit little cheese factories. We love cheese! It was always something to do but we never got around to it."

They began the permitting process to convert an old milkhouse into a certified cheese-making facility.

In 2017, Nestucca Bay Creamery had a soft opening, debuting cheeses at area farmers markets. Amy was surprised by the reception.

"I just said, 'We'll make cheese and sell it and we'll see what happens.' I had no expectations for it and was surprised by how popular it was. I was really encouraged by that."

Look for Nestucca Bay Creamery Cheese at their shop in Cloverdale.

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

In downtown Tillamook, three floors showcase Native American artifacts, a 1911 stage coach, the natural history of local animals and birds, logging displays and much more. The 35,000 plus objects on display all point to the area's rich cultural history.

Teeming with color and whimsy

Latimer Quilt and Textile Center

Open the door to the Latimer Quilt and Textile Center in Tillamook and it's as if you, like Lewis Carroll's famous Alice, have fallen through the looking glass and landed squarely into an alternate world.

What makes this place special?

First, the center is a museum and is open to the public: anyone can pay the \$4 museum admission and see the beautiful rotating textile exhibits. Some of those exhibits are local history pieces while others are on loan from areas near and far.

The center also boasts hands-on classes taught by talented instructors. It's very common for both local and regional museum members to come take a class and end up staying for hours to help with other classes, or to volunteer. The Latimer Center has always been a space where questions are encouraged and skills are taught for the joy of learning.

More than a century ago, young scholars gathered in the building to learn math, writing and history. Back then it was called the Maple Leaf School. Today spinners and weavers, tatters and quilters, knitters and all sorts of artisans gather to work and learn. Museum goers are often astounded and delighted to see weavers working on vintage looms.

The Latimer Center is also a store. On the walls and along the walkways quality quilts and rugs, doilies and dolls, all made by local artists are for sale.

Finally, the Latimer Center is a repository. It is a place that preserves and archives textile artifacts from Tillamook County History. The repository is an invaluable piece to the center's community importance.

Built in 1995, the repository houses over 400 quilts and 300 textile artifacts. Volunteers work at cataloging the items. A team from the center travels to quilt shows and artisan fairs to showcase the center's artifacts. The oldest piece on display at the center is a hand-sewn quilt dating to 1878.

Donated quilts sometimes get deposited on the center's front doorstep. Other times, they have been mailed from across the country. In some instances, loved ones have carefully delivered family heirlooms and after deciding to donate the piece, have left with tears in their eyes, Carol said.

Visitors are welcome to tour the repository, but they need to call and arrange a touring time prior to their trip so that an additional staff member can lead their tour.

▼ Trees to Sea Scenic Byway



The 68 mile Trees to Sea Scenic Byway begins at the trailhead for the Banks-Vernonia State Trail in Banks, Oregon and proceeds down Main Street (Highway 47) to turn west on State Highway 6 near Mile Marker 49 to head toward the City of Tillamook.

The route then arcs north and west on Tillamook County's Wilson River Loop and Latimer Roads, in order to turn south on Highway 101 before turning right on State Highway 131 (Third Street in the City of Tillamook) for almost its full length until it ends at Cape Meares Lighthouse.

The Trees to Sea Scenic Byway route combines an abundance of local agriculture and forestry, history, and natural scenery in a manner where the sum is stronger than the individual parts. The traveler will witness a broad spectrum of intrinsic qualities ranging from the vast variety of scenic, historic, natural, and forestry values to be found when exploring the agricultural delights of rural western Washington County, passing through the Tillamook State Forest, moving along the Cape Meares peninsula, and viewing the expanse of the Tillamook Bay watershed. When travelers stop, they will be amazed by the extensive menu of ready recreational tangents onto which they can launch.

Three Capes Scenic Route

If you're looking for the most breathtaking views of the Tillamook Coast, the Three Capes Scenic Route is the perfect place to start.

Beginning in downtown Tillamook, this short 40-mile jaunt along the water reveals some of the most majestic natural landscapes that the Oregon Coast has to offer. The road is easy to follow, with ample signage that leads travelers west of Tillamook, angling around Tillamook Bay and Bay Ocean Spit, to Cape Meares Route.

As the scenic loop continues from Tillamook toward Oceanside, you'll be thrilled at the mesmerizing ocean views that have left people speechless for centuries.

Watch the ocean meet tranquil Netarts Bay (stop a while and go clamming at this popular shellfishing spot—just make sure you have a license before you head out!) as you travel up to Cape Lookout, where you are in a prime position to see the entire Tillamook coastline. Trek through the old-growth forest and along the beach here to stretch your legs.

From there, the road takes you through the Sandlake dunes into Pacific City, where Haystack Rock juts up from the depths of the Pacific Ocean at Cape Kiwanda. Drink in the magnificent view of this iconic coastal landmark.



Be a steward At Alder Creek Farm

Walking through Alder Creek Farm, you can tell the place is alive.

The creek trickles by. The ducks quack in the garden. Trees blossom and seeds sprout.

It's a place where the community gathers to grow vegetables and fruit, to celebrate the harvest, to preserve a little piece of Nehalem.

Alder Creek Farm houses a community garden, greenhouse, ethnobotanical trail, native plant nursery and a 50-acre wildlife sanctuary on the north edge of Nehalem Bay.

Every week (March through October), 40 volunteers tend to the community garden growing berries, vegetables, herbs, fruit, trees, and caring for the farm's ducks.

"The community garden serves the volunteers by way that they can take home food," Stewardship Lead Shane Sjorgren said. "And we provide the local food bank vegetables. So much that they can't take it all."

Gardeners don't tend individual plots, but rather everyone works together as a team focusing on a special area of the garden, like brassicas, nightshades, or the orchard. Native plants onsite give community members an opportunity to learn more about local ecology and traditional medicinal and culinary plant uses.

"It's a center for community activities, learning, and teaching about organic farming," Sjorgren said. "The Lower Nehalem Community Trust's focus is to protect the lands around the area of Nehalem and to keep them natural."

Alder Creek Farm practices composting, mulching, cover crops, worm composting, soil microorganisms, hoop houses, cloches, ducks as alternative pesticide control,

plants to attract birds and pollinators, elk and deer fences, hedgerows, renewable irrigation, and rain water catchment systems.

Alder Creek Farm also houses the Nehalem Teaching Trail, a hands-on learning experience that invites audiences to investigate native plants, their habitats, and the ancient Indian traditions surrounding their uses.

"Education-oriented from its very beginning, the Trust's board readily embraced the notion," said Doug Firstbrook, Lower Nehalem Community Trust board member. "There are many diverse ecosystems present on these 55 acres of land. We were alive in the land of possibilities, so a trail based on the regional flora with the opportunity to learn their historical and cultural significances seemed like a natural next step that would benefit the entire community."

"Stewardship Fridays" at Alder Creek Farm involve the community in restoration projects in the area.

Projects have included clearing bamboo and blackberry brush.

"This allows native plants a chance to grow because invasive species shield out the plants," Sjorgren said. "People want to come out and do their part...and that's one way they can feel like they're making an impact."

Every April Alder Creek Farm hosts a popular plant sale of healthy garden starts grown especially for the coastal climate. And every October the Harvest Festival is held to celebrate the bounty of the coast.

Visitors are welcome to peruse the community garden, follow the Nehalem Teaching Trail, or join in on a Stewardship Friday.



According to the owner and many others, the Old Wheeler Hotel, which includes eight guestrooms with bay views upstairs along Highway 101, is a hotspot of spectral activity.

Built in 1920, the hotel did brisk business during Wheeler’s lumber boom following construction of the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company railroad in 1911, which allowed local mills to ship their product inland. The building later served as a nationally renowned, experimental arthritis clinic and a rural hospital before eventually being renovated to serve as a hotel again.


The owner describes that resident ghosts, or “permanents,” as she prefers to call them, include one that enjoys watching television in Room No. 3, as evidenced by the small indentation he leaves on the side of the bed in that room, and the fact that guests have reported the TV inexplicably coming on in the middle of the night, and showing old black-and-white @ movies.

"My goal with family portraits is to create memories for them," Gard said. "Pick a location that's memorable to you...a beach you have been coming to and have memories at."

Should we all be color-coordinated?

When dressing your family, stay in the neutral family. Gard recommends thinking about what colors will go well with the rest of your home's décor.

"These photos shouldn't be stuck on a CD or USB drive...these are meant to be on wall or on a beautiful canvas."

Should I bring my dog?

"I get that pets are another extension of your family," Gard said. But, she highly recommends that someone else come along to take care of the dog so that Fido is safe and out of harm's way when it's time for a human-only photo.

Plan ahead

Many of our local photographers book weddings and portraits, but you'll need to plan ahead.

"Just as you would book ahead for your hotel, that's about the same time you should be calling," Gard said.



Thirty years ago, Jeffrey and Valerie Folkema purchased the Garibaldi Marina and have been working ever since to create added value and experiences for visitors to the fishing community.

In addition to moorage and boat rentals, the Garibaldi Marina offers visitors a glimpse into the working landscape of the Tillamook Coast.

“People don’t have to enjoy fishing to enjoy watching fish be loaded off a boat,” Valerie said. “People are tickled pink when they see something that they’ve never seen before while they’re on vacation.”

The Folkemas believe that exposing visitors to the working side of tourism makes people more aware of their impact.

“There are experiences that people can have that they’ll leave with the impression of how to be good stewards,” Valerie said. “Eat the abundance, see where your food is grown, and be a participant in that story.”

Shop at the Dock events, hosted at the Garibaldi Marina, are the perfect way for visitors to get an inside look at the fishing industry. Tours of local, commercial fisheries are offered March through September, and fresh seafood can be purchased directly off the boats. The tours are free, but registration is required as space is limited.

“Visitors feel more cemented because you’ve allowed them to be part of a lifestyle that they don’t have,” Valerie said. “We’re not just showing the pretty side, but people can come out here and get dirty and volunteer to learn how to farm, how to fish.”


And Valerie adds that experiences can be just as valuable and memorable as a souvenir.

Jennifer Robitsch, owner of Madeline’s Vintage Marketplace in Tillamook, says that you can mix a lot of different looks to achieve that desired beachy feel.


“You can even go contemporary: you can add golds and glass to go upscale.”

Hike the Sand Dune @ Cape Kiwanda



Cape Kiwanda occupies a swath of beach in Pacific City that is stunningly beautiful. Comprised of sandstone as opposed to basalt, Cape Kiwanda is a photogenic oddity on the Oregon Coast. Now, there aren't miles of trail to be explored, but this isn't your typical beach stroll either.

By starting at the Pacific Avenue Trailhead, you can enjoy a roughly two mile out and back hike that explores a scenic stretch of beach that approaches the cape from the south. Vehicles are not allowed on the stretch leading up to Cape Kiwanda.

As you near the large, sandstone bluffs of the cape, watch for doryman launching boats. Ascend the Great Dune and take in the views along the top of the cape.

The vibrant orange and yellow hued sandstone cliffs have eroded into a number of curious and photo-worthy patterns over the years, and you could spend a long time taking it all in. There are a number of desirable vantages, just make sure to stay behind the fenced areas and abide by all signage.

Coastal Shoppers

In Cloverdale, get a taste of nostalgia at Katie's Korner soda factory. After savoring the bubbles and fizz, visit the Rusty Cow just next door where you'll find antiques, a massage room and a hair salon. Under the same roof is Thomas Goodwin's Art Gallery. This area is really your one-stop-shop. BJ's Fabrics is a mecca for quilters and textile fans. Stop for cheese and ice cream at the Nestucca Bay Creamery Store.

You can stay at a hotel, and so can your family's horse! At Crazy A's Horse Hotel in Cloverdale they'll take great care of your hooved friend. They'll need the rest after riding around the 484 acres at Bob Straub State Park. But, maybe your family prefers something with a motor. Visitors come from miles around to enjoy Sand Lake Recreation Area, where you can enjoy driving an all-terrain vehicle.




Today, few traces remain of Mt. Hebo's days as a Cold War-era U.S. military station.

However, from 1956 until 1980, Mt. Hebo was home to a U.S. Air Force General Surveillance Radar Station, a long-range radar installation, with 4,000 people serving there over the years. The purpose of the station, which worked in conjunction with McChord Air Force Base in Washington, D.C., was to prevent the USSR from attacking the region by air.

These days, as part of the Siuslaw National Forest, the 3,100-foot-tall mountain is better known for its camping, hiking, horseback riding and fishing opportunities, not to mention its views. None of the Air Force buildings remain.

Part of the Coast Range, Mt. Hebo straddles the Tillamook and Yamhill County lines and offers 360-degree vistas from its summit, which is accessed by an 8-mile forest service road from the community of Hebo. The U.S. Forest Service, which occupies offices at the base of the mountain, manages the area.

Neskowin Ghost Forest



The Tillamook Coast is spectacular no matter what the season, but winter is the only time you are likely to glimpse the Neskowin Ghost Forest.

The petrified remains of roughly 100 Sitka spruce trees are more than 2,000 years old and only visible during the lowest December, January and February tides.

Before the late 1990s, the stumps were mere local legend, with longtime south Tillamook County residents saying they only emerged once every several decades, and then only briefly. However, since the winter of 1998, the barnacle-encrusted Ghost Forest has reliably returned year after year.

In their prime, the trees would have been enormous, towering 150 to 200 feet tall. Experts say the spruces were initially buried as a result of a massive earthquake plunging higher ground to below sea level. A subsequent tsunami most likely then enveloped the trees in sand.


Family Adventures

Driving to the Tillamook Coast

The Tillamook Coast is just 73 miles from Portland. You can reach the region several ways: Highway 26 to 101, and turn south; Highway 26 to Highway 6, taking you through the Tillamook Forest and into the center of downtown Tillamook; or Highway 22 or Highway 18 from Salem and Corvallis. You can also reach it from Newport and Lincoln City - just head north on Highway 101.

Bus service through The Wave

The Wave provides passenger bus and dial-a-ride services county-wide as far north to Cannon Beach, south to Lincoln City, west to Pacific City and east to Portland. The Tillamook County Transportation District (TCTD) also offers intercity bus service to Portland, Oregon with regional connections. Buses have a two-bike capacity and are ADA-accessible with a wheelchair lift.
